The two-word phrase one's self is only justifiable when self is used in a spiritual, philosophical, or psychological sense. In all other cases, one's self can be replaced with the pronoun oneself.

One's self is not a reflexive pronoun, and should not be used as such. It is appropriate, however, when describing a self in the psychological or spiritual sense. In this context, one's becomes a possessive referencing a person other than the speaker .
