What I learned working with at-risk youth

High-risk youths often are referred to as "the disconnected" because they rarely have family to rely on or a healthy support network to help guide them; their lives may be filled with risks and characterized by drugs, sexual exploitation, violence, living on the streets, and family breakdown; and they typically have difficulty trusting adults and perceive that they're alone in the world.

A Different Approach to High-Risk Youths

Below are three strategies I have learned over the years and regularly exercise in the field when working with troubled teens. #1: Confidence, Patience, and Thick Skin It is an almost instinctual response.

Of those who did reoffend, 69.7% were rated as high-risk, 24.2% as moderate-risk and only 6.1% as low-risk (see Borum et al. 2005). In 2008, Welsh et al. reported the results of a study comparing the predictive and incremental validity of three adolescent risk-assessment instruments among a sample of 133 youth court referrals.

However, use of these evidence-based therapies is very low among adolescents: only 2.4 percent of adolescents in treatment for heroin use receive medication treatment, and only 0.4 percent of adolescents in treatment for prescription opioid use receive medication treatment (Feder, Krawczyk, and Saloner 2017).
